Guy Jones (DIRECTOR) Guy studied at the University of Manchester and was on the National Theatre Directors Course. He has been climbing the fells in the Lake District since he was about six years old. Carmen Nasr (WRITER)Carmen is a British-Lebanese writer. In 2022, along with *The Climbers* at Theatre by the Lake, her play *The Maladies* was performed by the Almeida Theatre Young Company, at The Yard theatre in London. In 2017 Carmen won the Channel 4 Playwright's scheme with *Dubailand* and was awarded a year-long residency at the Finborough Theatre. In February 2017 *Dubailand* premiered at the Finborough Theatre and Carmen subsequently received an Off West End Award nomination for Most Promising New Playwright. In 2018 she was commissioned by Kiln Theatre for their *Mapping Brent* project working with their selected young company to create *Let Kilburn Shake*, performed in 2019. Her first play *The House of my Father* was long-listed for the Bruntwood Prize for Playwriting in 2015.

Carmen has been a member of the Orange Tree Writers Collective, the Royal Court Playwriting Group, Hampstead Theatre's Writing the Bigger Picture group, and has an MA in Playwriting from Royal Holloway University.
