"Three disasters. Two world wars, one bloody big depression. And every time, the band play on."

Brass runs in Shane's family, and in the midst of yet another cost of living crisis he looks back on the last great battle for the local pit and the defiant glory of Grimley Colliery Band.

It's 1994 and the tight-knit mining community of Grimley, Yorkshire, are fighting to keep their colliery open. 



On the wet West Cumbrian coast, James and Kamran have been mates for more than a decade. At seventeen, the world should be theirs but Workington's a ghost town - an unemployment blackspot where lasses drink Bacardi by the pint and boys don't cry.

When James discovers he is heir to a single mile of the British railway system, the lads are forced on a town-wide treasure hunt where annihilated aunties. Snakebite-drenched drag queens and a zombie Princess Diana lay in wait. But who rightfully owns the mile of steel? Why is Kamran in such a strop? And what really happens in the pub down by the docks?

In a town once rich with coal seams and ore, with community and carnivals, with sea air and ale, James and Kamran are fed up with feeling different - tonight they're painting the town technicolour and asking what it means to be a man in a play about first loves, forging identities and the wild, wild hearts of teenage boys.

This brand new play by Lee Mattinson is produced by Theatre by the Lake and after its premiere in Keswick will tour to The Centre in Maryport, The Beggars Theatre in Millom, Florence Arts Centre in Egremont, and The Carnegie in Workington.



The Dreamtime Fellrunner is a poetic, fun and moving exploration of Julie's fellrunning life. Presenting fellrunning as a type of land art and spiritual practice, this is an aesthetic performance that allows people to experience the beauty of a wonderful sport, regardless of their degree of familiarity with the fells and running.

Emphasising body-mind-spirit-place connections, The Dreamtime Fellrunner encounters themes of feminism, land rights, ageism and ableism, history and literature, while carrying us on a journey through the Lakeland fells.

"As an older female athlete with a congenital spinal disability I have experienced significant barriers, but I have also gained huge emotional, spiritual and physical reward from being a fellrunner. I want to question certain ideas around outdoor sport being masochistic madness for the macho. I want to question why we think that something called Nature is out there - when we ourselves are animal beings and part of an ecosystem.

Above all I want to perform the aesthetic of fellrunning in a way that allows people to feel the incredible beauty of it."

This immersive performance also features a discussion and Q&A following the interval.


